


CHAPTER 1 WHY HAVE A BLOCK PARTY?

Block parties are a great way to meet your neighbors! They provide a casual and relaxed setting where residents can meet, play, eat and have fun together. This is a great time to exchange phone numbers and build connections.

CHAPTER 2 HOW TO PLAN!

Planning can be easy and quick with these simple steps.

- 1. Allow at least 6 weeks of planning before the event.
- Find a group of neighbors willing to host the block party and have one main contact.
- Decide on what food will be at your party. Potluck style, hotdogs, hamburgers, tacos, BBQ, etc.
- Delegate tasks for neighbors: Set up, activities, invitations, decorations, food, drinks, set up, clean up, etc.
- 5. Pick a date, time, and location for your block party.
- Please make sure to contact streets at least 3 weeks prior to the party if you want your neighborhood street blocked off.
- Don't forget this is stress free and a fun way to get to know your neighbors, police officers, firemen, EMS, and city officials.

CHAPTER 3 TYPE OF PARTY

- Contact name and number


When neighbors arrive have each person sign-in on the sign-in sheet provided below. This will help your HOA have names, numbers, emails, and addresses.

- Turn off grill
- Dump ice/water
- Remember to return all items to the correct persons
- Save leftover items (that will not expire) for future neighborhood gatherings
- Share leftover food for neighbors wanting to take them home
